Sub: Tamil Nadu Government Servants' Conduct Rules, 1973 – Thiru.A.S.Ravi, I Additional District Munsif, Tiruchirappalli – Permission to sell the jewels of his spouse – Intimation of – Reg.

Ref: Your letter in D.No.381/2011, dt. 28.03.2011.

With reference to the letter cited, I am to state that the Tamil Nadu Government Servants' Conduct Rules, 1973, does not require a Government Servant to intimate the disposal / acquisition of immovable properties by his / her spouse or family members which were acquired out of their own source of income. But, according to the High Court's circular in R.O.C. No. 2548/96/C2, dt. 01.04.97, the Officer has to intimate the acquisition of immovable properties by his spouse eventhough he has not contributed anything towards the said transaction.

Moreover, if the immovable property is proposed to be acquired or disposed of by the Government Servant, by lease, mortgage, purchase, sale gift, exchange or otherwise in his own name or any member of the family of the Government Servant, out of the resources of the Government Servant, a prior notice / permission is necessary.

However, the aforesaid transaction if any have to the disclosed in the property statement.
