The Hon'ble High Court, in its Full Court Meeting discussed about the norms fixed for the Subordinate Judicial Officers and resolved to re-fix the norms for disposal of cases by the Subordinate Judicial Officers, as per the recommendations of the Hon'ble Norms Committee.

The revised norms for disposal of cases to all the Subordinate Judicial Officers in the State of Tamil Nadu and Union Territory of Puducherry, and the new guidelines are as follows:

I. PERIOD OF REVIEW & GROUPING

The Qualitative and Quantitative work done by the Judicial Officers shall be assessed Quarterly in a year i.e., January to March, April to June, July to September and October to December.

The work done statement for the first quarterly shall be submitted before 10th of April.

The work done statement for the second quarterly shall be submitted before 10th of July.

The work done statement for the third quarterly shall be submitted before 10th of October.

The work done statement for the fourth quarterly shall be submitted before 10th of January of the next year.

NOTE:-

- 1. For the Officers in the cadre of Senior Civil Judges, for whom the pendency of cases is less than 500, it is enough that they shall reach 13 units. [For other Officers there is no such relaxation]
- If in a month, the officer has worked for less than the number of actual working days due to leave, other duty, etc., for such month, norms shall be proportionate to the number of days actually worked by him/her.

Illustration:-

- Number of court working: 22 days days
- > Number of days officer: 18 days worked
- > Norms Fixed for the Officer : 17 units
- \succ For 18 days norms to be : 17 achieved X 18 = 13.90 units

3. If an officer disposes of any case while he / she is incharge of another court, that disposal shall also be counted as against his / her account

4. Old Cases:-

- (a) Disposal of seven years and more than seven years old money suits, norms shall be reckoned as 1 1/2 times of the units fixed for the money suits [which are less than seven years old]
- **(b)** Disposal of seven years and more than seven years old suits [other than money suits], norms shall be reckoned as 2 times of the units fixed for such suits or as 3 times of the units fixed for appeals [which are less than seven years old]
- (c) Disposal of seven years and more than seven years old criminal cases, norms shall be reckoned as 1 1/2 times of the units fixed for such cases [which are less than seven years old]
- (d) Disposal of seven years and more than seven years old cases under the provisions of The Prevention of Corruption Act or offences relating to Commercial Crimes, norms shall be reckoned as 2 times of the units fixed for such cases [which are less than seven years old]
- (e) Disposal of fifteen years and more than fifteen years old cases of all categories, the norms shall be reckoned as 3 times of norms fixed for such cases [which are less than seven years old]
