## ABSTRACT

Public Services – proviso under rule 9 (4) (b) of the Tamil Nadu Pension Rules, 1978 – Omitted - Instructions - Issued

### ORDER

As per the amendment issued in the Government Order read above, rule 9 (1) (a) of the Tamil Nadu Pension Rules, 1978, empowers the competent authority to reserve themselves the right of withholding or withdrawing a pension or part thereof as a measure of penalty, against the proven charges. The proviso stipulated under Rule 9 (1) (a) of the Tamil Nadu Pension Rules, 1978, is as follows:

"Provided that before passing an order under this clause, if the pensioner does not agree to such withholding or withdrawal of the pension, the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission shall be

.......The Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission need not be consulted in cases where the pensioner agrees to withholding or withdrawal of the pension ......."

2. As per the amendment issued in the Government Order read above, rule 9 (1) (b) of the Tamil Nadu Pension Rules, 1978, empowers the Competent Authority, the right of ordering recovery from the Pension / Death cum Retirement Gratuity of the whole or part of the pecuniary loss caused by such grave misconduct or negligence. The proviso stipulated under Rule 9 (1) (b) of the Tamil Nadu Pension Rules, 1978, is as follows:

"Provided that before passing an order under this clause, the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission shall be consulted by the Government in respect of pensioners belonged to State Service and in respect of the pensioners who belonged to service other than State Service, the Head of the Department concerned, after arriving at the amount of recovery, shall refer the case to the Government and the Government; after consulting the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission shall intimate the views of the Commission to the Head of the Department concerned for issue of final orders."

- 3. Instances have been brought to the notice of the Government that when a pensioner agrees to the proposed penalty under rule 9 (1) (a) of the Tamil Nadu Pension Rules, 1978, there is no need to consult Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission as instructed under the proviso of the said rule. But for exercising the right of the competent authority to effect the recovery of loss from the pension, Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission is being consulted as laid down under the proviso to rule 9 (1) (b) of the Tamil Nadu Pension Rules, 1978. The said repugnancy forcing the competent authority to compulsorily consult Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission with respect to the component of recovery of loss, even in cases where the pensioner agrees to the proposed penalty.
- 4. In rule 9 (1) (b) of the Tamil Nadu Pension Rules, 1978 itself it has been laid down that it is the right of the Competent Authority for ordering recovery from Pension or Death cum Retirement Gratuity of the whole or part of the pecuniary loss caused by such grave misconduct or negligence, since such recovery is not of the character of penalty.
- 5. There is no provision available in the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission Regulations, 1954 for seeking its views when the competent authority takes action for ordering a recovery of pecuniary loss from Pension or Death cum Retirement Gratuity. Thus the proviso under rule 9 (1) (b) of the Tamil Nadu Pension Rules, 1978 has not also been validated under Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission Regulations, 1954.
- 6. The Government after due examination in the light of the above context, have decided to omit the proviso made under rule 9 (1) (b) of the Tamil Nadu Pension Rules, 1978, and ordered accordingly.
- 7. Necessary amendment to the Tamil Nadu Pension Rules, 1978 will be issued separately by the Finance Department.
