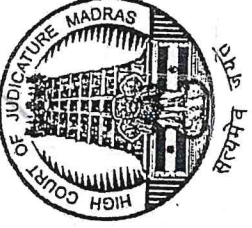
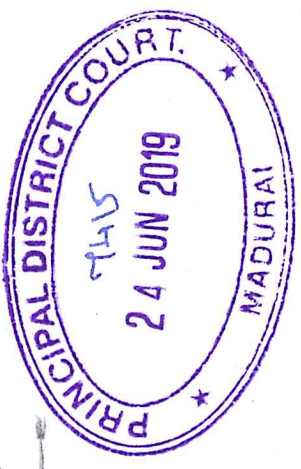

OFFICIAL MEMORANDUM

Sub: TNJMS - Selection of candidates for filling up of vacancies in the Subordinate Courts - Judicial Recruitment Cell, High Court, Madras - Sanctioned by the Government for the Centralized Recruitment of staff members for various posts, except the posts falling under the purview of TNPSC - Selection process already initiated by Appointing Authorities/Unit Heads - Certain particulars called for and directions issued - Reg.

The Government vide G.O.Ms.No.2121, Home (Courts-I) Department, dated 25.10.2018, have accepted the proposal of the Registry to create Judicial Recruitment Cell and accorded sanction / no objection for creation of the same by the High Court of Madras, in terms of the directions/observations made by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, for the recruitment of Staff members in the Judicial Service in the State of Tamil Nadu, except for the posts of Civil Judge in Tamil Nadu State Judicial Service and Junior Assistant, Typist and Steno Typist (Grade-III) in Tamil Nadu Judicial Ministerial Service, as the said posts are under the purview of TNPSC as per Articles 234 and 320(1) of the Constitution of India.

In compliance of the directions issued by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in Suo Motu Writ Petition (Civil) No.2/2018, dated 17.01.2019 and the Hon'ble Division Bench of the High Court, Madras in W.P.No.6378 of 2018 and batch of cases, dated 30.04.2019, all the Principal Districts Judges/Unit Heads in the State of Tamil Nadu are taking steps to fill up all the vacancies which are to be filled up by direct recruitment and outside the purview of the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission, by issuing Notifications calling for applications for various posts in their respective Districts / Units.

While considering the stage of the recruitment process and problems faced by the Appointing Authorities/Principal District Judges/ Unit Heads / Chief Judicial Magistrates in conducting selection process, the High Court found that no uniform methodology is being followed by the Appointing Authorities/Principal District Judges/ Unit Heads / Chief Judicial Magistrates in the ongoing selection process. Further, it is also felt by the High Court that the Appointing Authorities/Principal District Judges/Unit Heads / Chief Judicial Magistrates do not have sufficient expertise, infrastructure, manpower, funds, etc to handle the ongoing recruitment process and hence the process could not be completed by them within the time frame. Therefore, the High Court is of the view that the Centralized Recruitment is the best possible option to complete the recruitment process within a time frame. In which event, it is made clear that, the High Court Recruitment Cell will be the Recruiting Authority and the Appointing Authority shall be the respective Principal District Judge / Unit Head / Chief Judicial Magistrate, as per the existing Rules with all disciplinary powers.

In view of the above, all the Appointing Authorities/Principal District Judges / Units Heads / Chief Judicial Magistrates in the State of Tamil Nadu are required to furnish the particulars, as mentioned in the Annexure, in the prescribed format, on or before 25.06.2019 to the High Court, Madras without fail, through e-mail (csectionhc@gmail.com).

All the Appointing Authorities/Principal District Judges / Unit Heads / Chief Judicial Magistrates in the State of Tamil Nadu are hereby instructed to defer all further proceedings in the recruitment process initiated and await further instructions from the High Court. Even where examinations had been conducted or Viva Voce conducted, the same shall also be deferred;

They are further instructed that wherever required, the candidates may be informed that recruitment process has been deferred on administrative grounds.
