Lok Adalat - Procedures to be followed in respect of holding of Lok Adalat - Instructions Issued.

July aims Under the Legal Services Authorities Act 39 of 1987, the Lok Dvide dalats have become a statutory scheme and in Chapter VI of the Legal Services Authorities Act, provisions have been made to after Egulate the procedure.

The question of issuance of a circular prescribing the rocedures to be followed by the courts while holding Lok Adalats, sconsidered by the High Court, in the light of provisions contained no Chapter VI of the Act and as directed, the following instructions are issued to the Subordinate courts for strict observance in the matter:

- he i. The record of settlements before the Lok Adalat should be full and complete, covering all points in dispute, and conforming to the requirement of procedure and in proper legal terms and shall be signed by the parties and their counsel;
  - 2. There would be no need for a separate decretal order.
  - 3. The record of settlement in cases pending in courts and drawn from them shall be returned to the respective court to be dealt with, in the further stages, and to be maintained and dealt with, according to the rules.
  - 4. It is not necessary to maintain a separate register, for cases detailed in clause (3) and that it would be adequate if the Adalat settlement is recorded in the respective registers.

- 5. The records of Adalat settlements in cases not brought before the court, also shall together with the records presented and considered by the Adalat, be received in the court, whi would have had the jurisdiction to entertain the matter and which the Lok Adalat was convened, to be registered and de with, in the further stages and to be maintained and dealt will
- 6. For the cases received under clause (5) it would not necessary for the court to maintain a separate register for successory, but only two registers shall be maintained, one criminal cases and another for civil cases.
- 7. The award of a Lok Adalat shall bear the seal of the respet tive court in respect of:
  - (i) any case pending before; or

according to the rules.

(ii) any matter which is falling within the jurisdiction of and is not brought before any court, for which the Lok Adalat is organised.

All the Principal District and Sessions Judges, the Principal Judge, City Civil Court, the Chief Judge, Court of Small Causes and the Chief Metropolitan Magistrate, Egmore, Chennai, are required to communicate this circular instructions to all the Subordinate Courts, under their control, for compliance.

The receipt of the Official Memorandum is required to be acknowledged at once.
