## CIRCULAR

Sub: Court-Criminal-Offences under Section 138
of the Negotiable Instrument Act by invoking
the remission-G.O. issued by the State

Government-Subordinate Judiciary would not
invoke the remission G.O.-The Legislative
competence of the Union Government-Instructions
Issued.

It has been brought to the notice of the High Court that the Sabordinate Judiciary frequently would give remission to the sentence of imprisonment for the offence under Section 138 of the Negotiable Instruments Act by invoking the G.Os. issued by the State Government, thereby directing the accused not to surrender to the Judicial Custody to undergo the period of sentence. On the strength of the guidelines given by the Apex Court, the High Court directed that the subordinate courts cannot invoke the remission G.O's issued by the State Government to give remission, to the sentence, that too, in the cases relating to the offences under the Megotiable Instrument Act, which is within the legislative competence of the Union Government.

The above principles have been laid down in the judgment of the High Court in Crl.R.C. 187/2001.

A copy of the Judgment of the High Court is communicated to all the subordinateCriminal courts for their guidence.

The Presiding Officers are required to strictly follow the Principle laid down in the above Judgment without any deviation in future.
